#### **HKU Global Alumni Convention**

The first-ever HKU Global Alumni Convention was held in Shanghai, China from November 2 to 4.

There were over 600 delegates at the Convention – about half came from Hong Kong and overseas (including UK, USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Malaysia and Singapore) and the rest were from Shanghai and other cities on the Chinese Mainland.

The Convention's theme was "Discover Shanghai . Discover China – Tomorrow Today" 《中國 • 上海 • 今天看明天》. Through the discovery and re-discovery of Shanghai, the event provided a platform where delegates could gain insights into China's future on the world stage, and determine the role HKU Alumni can play in these critical times of change.

It was also a great networking opportunity and a special time for reunions for many of the alumni amid fine dining and fun activities. The Convention also included site visits and special tours for a closer look at different aspects of Shanghai's development and potential.

#### One Heart, One Family


The University of Hong Kong, with its missions and illustrious record, has always enjoyed the support of the community and the University Family.

The first year's \$100 million target has been met!

The second year's matching now begins, we need your continuous support!

In the 3rd Government Matching Grant Scheme launched by the Government on June 1, 2006 on a first-come, first-served basis, HKU has again reached the ceiling granted by the Government. The Matching provides the financial resources needed to implement the University's education and research programs.

Over 100 departments, units and programs have benefited from this exercise. In the past four months alone, gifts have come from some 1,100 donors (members of the public, alumni and staff), including 140 donors (individual or foundation) from overseas. This represents a strong and growing endorsement of the University's aspirations and its partnership with the community.

The matching momentum continues with the Stanley Ho Alumni Challenge which matches alumni and student donations (<a href="www.hku.hk/">www.hku.hk/</a> alumnichallenge). The excellent news is that the first-year's HK\$100 million has been successfully matched under this scheme which was launched last November. This Alumni Challenge is now entering its second year.

# How Friends of HKU handle your donations

The following provides you with an outline of how Friends of HKU ("Friends") processes a donation. The most common forms of donation received by Friends are checks and stocks donations.

When Friends receives the donation, a written acknowledgement will be issued to the donor within five working days. The donor will require the acknowledgement letter for claiming tax deductions for charitable contributions.

If you include your e-mail address in the form, we will be able to acknowledge receipt via e-mail before the physical acknowledgement letter arrives in your mail box. For stock donations or donations in other forms (e.g. planned gifts or donations in kind), please contact the Executive Director for further processing guidelines to ensure tax and other issues are properly covered.

Many alumni take advantage of the tax-exempt status of Friends by making regular donations to Friends around the year-end. Many are also aware that their employers may offer matching grants if they donate to tax-exempt organizations. Their donations generally will be doubled through matching on a one-to-one basis. The next time you make a donation to Friends, check with your employer to see if matching is available – you could be making an even bigger difference with the matching.

Over the past 12 months, Friends of HKU received many donations from alumni all across the US, from the East to the West Coast and as far away as Puerto Rico.

Friends also received corporate and foundation donations to support different faculties with their scholarships, conferences and research programs.

# HKU ranks 33rd among the world's top 100 Universities

According to The Times Higher Education Supplement published in the UK, this year The University of Hong Kong climbed eight places to rank 33rd among the

The rankings are based on a range of qualitative and quantitative criteria, including peer review carried out among academics, staff-to-student ratio, citations of academic papers and international outlook.

This ranking is an encouraging validation of the effectiveness of the University's strategic plans; yet there are still challenges ahead, such as human and physical resource planning, gaining the support and participation of the whole community, and managing the demands of excellence in teaching and research.

However, the University is not alone and it has the invaluable support of the University Family of alumni, faculty, students, parents and friends.
